Although the short session of the General Assembly doesn't start until May, special sessions continue to pass legislation. Watch for alerts from NCRSP!

MARCH

- Contact current NC legislators in your district and describe NCRSP goals.
- Meet legislators in their offices or invite them to one of your meetings.
- Ask them to address our goals and ask them questions to find out their views. (See "Seven Questions" document)
- Contact leaders of NCAE-Active groups in your region and ask for a joint meeting.
- Contact other similar goal-minded groups (retired groups, voter groups) to determine potential collaborations.
- Join NCAE-Active members to research and interview candidates running in the May 8th Primary.
- Join other groups in offering voter registration and education by the April 13th deadline* for registration for the May 8 primary; support NCAE endorsed candidates.

APRIL

- Register people until April 13; remind voters they can still register at Early Voting.
- Work for retiree/public education friendly candidates; encourage early voting.
- Inform people if there are important **constitutional amendments** on the ballot.

WATCH FOR ALERTS!

MAY

- Vote in May 8 Primary Election for pro-retiree, pro-education candidates for U.S. House, NC Legislature, NC Supreme Court, Judges, local races.
- Collaborate with NCAE Active locals to research and interview winning candidates elected in the primary.
- Watch for alerts regarding activities of the current General Assembly.

NCRSP LEGSILATIVE TIMELINE: COUNTDOWN TO NOVEMBER 6, 2018

JUNE

- Contact current NC legislators about a COLA and/or other important issues brought up in the 2018 short session.
- Lobby Day if needed.

JULY

- Research and meet, along with NCAE-Active groups, NC legislative candidates running in the Nov. 6 election; discuss endorsements.
- Collaborate with other groups on voter registration; start work for endorsed candidates.

AUGUST, SEPTEMBER, OCTOBER

• Work for endorsed candidates; voter registration, phone banking, canvassing, fund raising, promoting early voting.

NOVEMBER

• Get Out to Vote for the <u>NOVEMBER 6 GENERAL ELECTION</u> for NCAE endorsed candidates for U.S. House, NC Legislature, NC Supreme Court, Judges, local races.

*It's possible the primary may be delayed because of re-districting issues; it's still unclear if there will be a primary for appellate and trial judges.
